Grant Requests - Kendall O'Brien

- Sarah Greer, 5th grade is requesting \$2000 for field trips to the New Bedford Whaling Museum which aligns with our social studies and science standards and a field trip to the Natural History museum in Brewster. These field trips will give hands-on learning and will deepen their learning of key concepts.
 - Trying to keep price to no more than \$12/kid
 \$
 - Science and social studies standards hit
 - 4 days in March
 - What's leftover from Whaling Museum will go to transport for Natural History Museum
 - Vote to hold 5th Grade Grant Funding until January
 - Jackie motioned, Cara seconded, all approved
- Cheryl Eastman, 1st grade is requesting \$3558 to take the students to Coonamessett Farms in the spring. The Coonamessett farm Educational tour consists of: Farm tour(fields and greenhouses), farm animals, and feeding the chickens. We are also able to do a planting project. This field trip directly connects with curriculum (animals, life-cycles and plants), it also connects with the school/DEIB/PTA initiatives and garden project.
 - Tour lasts about an hour
 - Planting project ties into all curriculum of plants, animals, life cycles + DEIB and sustainable farming project
 - \$3,558 total cost of trip
 - 4 vs. 3 school busses (9 classes total)
 - Plan to go in the spring
 - Potential funding available for Cultural Events bc of tie in to indigenous
 - Follow up with Cyndi (not in attendance)
 - Vote to approve \$3,000 toward 1st grade trip
 - Jackie motioned, Mary Beth seconded, all approved
- Lisa Kent, Kindergarten is requesting \$3000 for transportation + chaperone costs to the Buttonwood Zoo.
 - Not been on an "actual field trip" since 19-20 school year (have had visitors come to FD)
 - May, 2025
 - Touring zoo ties into ARC curriculum (reading, writing, ELA), zoo has an exhibit for each unit
 - Interactive treasure hunt/nature walk (to be created by the K team)
 - 3 busses (3 kids per seat)
 - Additional \$230 for chaperones (2 per class)
 - Buttonwood is covering all admission for students and 20
 - Val motions to approve up to \$3,000, Antonia seconded, all in favor
- Marilyn Dunlavey, 4th grade is requesting \$2000 for field trips to Blake planetarium and Waquoit Bay National Estuarine Reserve.
 - Repeat last year's field trips students loved it, memorable
 - Waquoit Bay really hands on goes with ELA ARC + Life Sciences unit on animal adaptations
 - Blake Planetarium aligns with science curriculum
 - Kids paid \$5 total for both trips
 - Bussing is the majority of the cost

- Fund request for 10K for Sugar Plum 2025
 - Cara asking what our plan is to make back what we spend
 - Finding out what we have left in inventory before we enter into 2025 planning
 - Not as many \$6-8 items available to buy this year
 - Idea to have a "fire sale" to get rid of everything
 - Future conversations about renting a storage space
 - Cara makes a motion to approve, Shana seconded, all approved
- Request: Using scholastic dollars to provide the **Book Vending Machine** at Oak Ridge
 - Have been able to give teachers roughly \$75 in years past
 Want to continue to be able to provide that
 - Want to continue to be able to provide that
 - Can use a good chunk (\$12,000) of scholastic dollars for a book vending machine
 - Holds around 210 books restock for \$1,200 OR you can restock your own
 - Jackie makes a motion to approve, Antonia seconded, all approved
- Events team follow up:

We need to address how events are organized moving forward, as our current structure isn't very sustainable. I propose breaking events into individual loop committees, with smaller teams working together instead of relying on one group. We attempted this approach with Sugar Plum, but likely started too late for it to be fully effective. Now is a great opportunity to develop and refine this model for next year, especially since it's a year-long planning process for sugar plum specifically.

Cultural Events - Cyndi Rotondi

- 2000 requested from Cultural Funds to welcome Acapella Group performance and workshop at Oak Ridge on May 9th. The group would perform for grades 5,6.
- Antonia motion to approve, Shana seconded, all approved
- 4,500 Cultural Funds requested by Forestdale to establish collaboration with Wampanoag tribe regarding tribal methods and practices for gardening. This project would bring CheeNulka (cha-noh-kay) and others from the tribe into the FD community in a pragmatic and meaningful way that can teach future generations of Forestdale students the benefits of growing and eating healthy food. The partnership should create and develop connections for a more sustainable and informed community of students.
- Joanne Saunders came to speak on behalf of the event
 - Were denied funds from Mass Cultural Council
 - Jackie suggested DESE farm to school grant for next year (up to \$30,000)
- Mr. D. talked about his long term goals for the school garden at Forestdale
 - Reference to school in Vermont doing similar farm to table initiatives
- Jackie made a motion to approve, Cara seconded, all approved
