Grant Requests - Kendall O'Brien

- 5th Grade (Stephanie Handrahan) is requesting \$4224 for bussing and admission to the New Bedford Whaling Museum. Students will also be able to go inside the inflatable humpback whale. Trips are planned on or around 3/24/26.
 - \$24 per student
 - \$4,1
- 6th Grade (Deb Stanton & Carol Archambault) is requesting \$3500 to cover all costs for students to attend a performance of "The Never Ending Story" at The Harwich Junior Theatre on 4/16/26. Also requesting \$2000 for their annual end of the year trip to Oak Crest Cove in June. This will cover bussing and pizza costs. (Total \$5500)
- 4th Grade (Marilyn Dunlavey) is requesting \$2000 for transportation to our field trip to the Waquoit Bay National Estuarine Research Reserve on May 26th, 28th, and 29th. This field trip aligns directly with our fourth grade Life Science and Earth Science standards (Earth's Systems ESS2-1 and From Molecules to Organisms LS1-1). On this field trip, students will get hands-on experience with concepts like animal adaptations (aligned with our fourth grade ARC curriculum), weathering, erosion, deposition, and geology. Students will be able to make real-world connections to these topics as they relate to their home; Cape Cod. We discuss our impacts as residents and stewards of Cape Cod,

and what we can do to help our communities and ecosystems. We also make connections to the Mashpee Wampanoag tribe and to learn about the people who settled this part of Cape Cod, which relates to our learning in social studies. This is a highly engaging field trip, and students have raved about their time at Waquoit Bay. We are requesting \$2,000 for bussing to this field trip over three days. We would have 2-3 classes attend on each day (May 26, 28, 29). The total cost for last year was \$1,874. The bus pricing tends to increase each year, so the \$2,000 would help us make this field trip free for all students and take the financial pressure off of families.

- OR Art (Carly Smith) is requesting \$1120 ChompSaw Cardboard Saws (5-saw bundle).
- FD Science (Chrissi Howell) is requesting \$1800 for a Marine Education program -Salt (the inflatable humpback whale) to visit all grade 2 students one day in the spring. There will be hands-on educational activities that the students can do besides going inside this model of a whale. Each class in grade 2 will visit Salt and do the activities during one school day. Scheduled for May 2026.
